
#### 1. Course Book



# Frequently asked questions:

## How long do I have to complete the course?

You can complete the course as quickly as you wish or take as long as you need. Some people take one system and study it over one month; some people will do it in a week and others faster. It all depends on your time availability.

## Are there any assignments?

No there are no mandatory assignments just an end of course examination. We give a small multiple choice question paper on the system last taught at last class; it is a learning tool for you.

## What is the final ITEC assessment format?

The examination is a multiple-choice paper consisting of 50 questions.

You have 55minuets to complete the paper.

It has one question with four possible answers (the correct one being on the paper)

ITEC describe it as one stem and 3 'distractor' questions

If you follow the quiz questions available it will help you pass the paper.

Marks are as follows: 50% = pass. 75% = credit. 90% = distinction.

You have the option of taking the examination via computer or you can sit an actual physical paper (when allowed regarding current Covid-19) the paper and answers are returned to ITEC for marking. This can take a number of weeks.

# How do I book the examination?

You must give us eight weeks' notice in writing, this is an ITEC regulation.

We also run exams the second Saturday in December each year and the Saturday of the bank holiday weekend in May each year. You could also aim for those dates if you wish or choose your own, individual exams are not available on weekend dates.

### Where do I take the examination?

You can take via zoom under supervision or inhouse with an actual paper exam at Green Tara College, Navan, under supervision as required by ITEC or via Zoom and the ITEC website.

#### What happens if I do not pass the examination?

You can re-sit the paper as many times as you wish and we are happy to facilitate this. Please note there is an additional examination booking fee each time.



## How much do I need to know?

Anatomy is such a large subject sometimes people become confused on how much they need to know.

Please see the **syllabus** which is the document provided by ITEC that informs you of what you need to learn and understand and know. You do NOT need to know anything more than what is on the syllabus. **The syllabus is the most important document** you have. You are required to understand and learn everything on the syllabus. This is what you are then examined on.

Please note the book may **not** have everything that is in the syllabus so then go to the notes etc.

#### How do I start?

Start with whichever system you wish to attend; it does not have to be in order. Regarding getting ahead yourself start with the book and the first chapter then the Cell then the Tissues. Please note the cell is often seen as the most 'challenging' system in the book so avoid worrying too much, you just need to keep repeating it and as you learn more it will make sense.

Learn one chapter and test yourself when you feel you know it.
